Nevada Electrical Qualifications Card Program

Electrical Card Renewals - CEU Requirements

CURRENT (Effective 1/1/2022):

To renew your Electrical Qualifications Card, you must obtain every three years a minimum of 1.8 CEUs (18 hours of instruction) for Electrical Journeyman, Residential, Sign or Low Voltage Technician, or 3.0 CEUs (30 hours) for Master, related to electrical code and safety-related topics. These CEUs must consist of the following at a minimum:

1. Eight hours or eight-tenths (0.8) CEUs must be from a code-change class highlighting code changes to the current edition or future enforced edition of the National Electrical Code for the renewal period.
2. Four hours or four-tenths (0.4) CEUs must be on Electrical Safety based on NFPA70E current edition for the renewal period.
3. The balance of the CEUs can be from other acceptable providers on electrical code and safety-related topics.

Only CEUs issued by specific organizations on electrical code and safety-related topics will be accepted. Please see the Approved Provider List for accepted organizations.

Card Renewal Information

The home page of the ESP website contains links to Approved CEU Provider information, New and Renewal Card Applications, new card issuance requirements and current electrical card renewal requirements.

Please feel free to call our office to check when your electrical card expires. This will prevent any late fees or your card falling out of the one-year grace period before final expiration. If your electrical card has been expired for more than one year, please contact ESP to discuss your options.

ESP strongly believes that the electrical industry should maintain strong electrical training and electrical knowledge for the safety of everyone involved.



Here are four reasons why you should have and maintain your Nevada electrical card:

1. Municipalities such as the City of Reno, Clark County, City of Las Vegas and City of Henderson have requirements for at least a journeyman electrical card when installing electrical systems;
2. Many employers incentivize team members that have a Nevada Electrical Qualifications Card (journeyman or master);
3. Your electrical qualifications card shows a prospective or current employer that you are seriously committed to the electrical trade; and
4. Your electrical qualifications card shows that you have not only gone through both classroom and on the job training, but you also know and understand the current installation requirements of the NEC.
